Topic Supplemental Report

MO: By unknown means, breaking out the front window of a business, in order to gain entry to attempt a theft.

Lt. Warner, Sir:

On 03/15/2008, at 0411hrs, units were dispatched to Lakewood Village at 13437 Madison on the report of a general alarm. Inv Deucher was first on scene. He notified officers via radio that there was a large hole in the front glass of the business. Units arrived and established a perimeter around the building. INV Deucher found the rear door to the business was unlocked. The business was checked with negative results.

The broken window was located on the Northwest side of the business, next to the West entrance door. There was no indication of what caused this damage to the window. The window was broken from the outside in. In checked the broken glass there was no indication that anyone had walked on the broken shards. The hole in the window was 32 inches by 32 inches. The hole was large enough that an adult human could fit through the hole.

The west side of the bar is a seating area. All the barstools were turned upside down on tables. One barstool was found knocked over on the floor. This chair was in line with the entrance to the east side of the bar and the hole in the window.

The east side of the bar is the main bar area. The liquor and the cash register are located in this section. In checking this area we noticed that one drawer behind the bar was open. Nothing else seemed disturbed.

To the south of the main bar area is the kitchen. The kitchen was the only place in the bar that had any lights on. It was dimly lit from a range light. The southern door, that was found unlocked, leads in and out of the kitchen.

In checking outside the business, Inv Deucher located an empty Crown Royal cloth bag, typically used to hold a bottle of liquor, on the West side of the building. The bag was dry, and the area around it was wet. This indicated that the bag was recently placed at this location. He took photographs of the above-referenced item and secured it as evidence.

Inv Deucher continued to process the scene. No fingerprints or other usable evidence were obtained.

The owner of the business, VIC/ BEAU E. MAXEY, was contacted and responded to the scene. He checked the business and advised nothing was missing. The money from that nights business receipts was where it was supposed to be.

We asked MAXEY about the open drawer behind the bar. He stated that it was unusual for that drawer to be open. He advised there is no money kept there at night, but there is money there during the day. He stated his employees and his customers would know that.

MAXEY had video cameras set up in the bar. He stated that a tape was in place and was recording after the business closed. We reviewed the tape with MAXEY and learned that the lighting at night was not sufficient enough to see any activity in the east or west sides of the bar. He did have a camera in the kitchen and we were able to watch the entrance to the kitchen for the East side of the bar.

In viewing the tapes, we discovered the times on the tapes were 57 minutes slower than the actual time that they happened. On the tape, at 03:12:29, a person wearing bulky winter clothes comes into the kitchen and runs WB through the kitchen towards the back door. The person is holding their arms up in front of their face, shielding their face from the camera. We were unable to make out any identifying features of the suspect in the video. We were unable to determine race or gender of the suspect.

At 03:18:15 INV Deucher's flashlight can be observed shining by the West entrance and the broken glass. At 03:22:20 PO BROWN and I are observed entering the kitchen to check the business.

MAXEY advised that he will provide a copy of the surveillance tape. He advised that he desires prosecution. MAXEY viewed the tape and could not identify the suspect. He had no suspect in the incident. MAXEY was asked about a Crown Royal bag. He did not see any relevance to the bag and this incident. He stated the bar does not keep any money in bags like that.
